- Celebrated our 50th anniversary with a series of successful online conferences, including our first-ever virtual international conference, *BEYOND: Global Mind Change in Action*, signaling a return to this legacy.
- Completed a deeply noetic recalibration of the IONS purpose and mission statements involving the entire organization and external stakeholders.
- Grown our endowment to currently exceed \$18 million, while responsibly stewarding all institutional assets.
- Initiated significant new, high-profile scientific collaborations with high-impact potential.

Two New Groundbreaking Books

Our scientists have released two new books to expand IONS' visibility and engage a broader audience.

Garret Yount wrote Why Vibes Matter: Understand Your Energy and Learn to Use it Wisely and Arnaud Delorme wrote Why Our Minds Wander: Understand the Science and Learn How to Focus Your Thoughts.



IONS Discovery Lab (IDL) Growth

Led by Director of Research Dr. Helané Wahbeh, IDL is conducting unprecedented research on the effects of transformative practices on interconnectedness, extended human capacities, and well-being. Over 9,000 records have already been collected, and we're in the process of collecting pre- and post-experience data from an additional 1,500 records, after which a final analysis will be conducted and made freely available.



Lucid Dreaming Impact

Our study on Healing PTSD with Lucid Dreaming provides powerful testimonials from research participants, with 92% reporting a significant reduction in PTSD symptoms and nightmare distress, with sustained improvements at one-month follow-up.
